Angie Mayer (Rudy) - Director

Angle is entering her third year with Mountain State Lacrosse, first year as the director. Mayer spent 2016-19 as the head coach at Alderson Broaddus and 15-16 as the assistant. She lead the team to win the Great Midwest Athletic Conference Tournament in 2017.

She graduated from the State University of New York College (SUNY) at Cortland in May of 2015 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Fitness Development and a minor in sport management. Mayer also earned an Associate's Degree in Physical Education at Herkimer County Community College in May of 2012.

Mayer began collegiate play at Herkimer in 2012 and was a team captain and finished as a runner-up for the second team all-conference.

In 2013 & 2014, she was a member of the SUNY Cortland women's lacrosse team that advanced to the NCAA Division III Final Four both seasons she played there. The Red Dragons lost to Trinity 8-6 in the semifinals in 2013 before winning a SUNY record 22 games her senior year as it fell once again to Trinity in semifinals 8-7.

Harley Kinney

Harley Kinney begins her second season as an assistant coach for the women's lacrosse program at Davis & Elkins during the 2022-2023 school year.

Kinney is the first hire for Pomeroy since taking the head coaching role at D&E back in early June of 2021. She arrived in Elkins following a stint as a coach for Black Lax, a premier high school girls lacrosse program located in Wisconsin.

Kinney was a high school standout in soccer, hockey, and cross country before beginning her playing career collegiately in soccer at Northland College in 2017. Kinney started her lacrosse career at Northland with Coach Pomeroy during the program's inaugural season in 2016-17.

Kinney transferred with Coach Pomeroy to Marian University in Wisconsin for the program's inaugural season while also continuing her hockey career. She worked at Plymouth Comprehensive High School as a special education teacher's aide during the 2020-21 school year, providing one-one-one aid, behavioral management, and life skill teaching.

Lee Testor

A product of New Fairfield, Connecticut, Lee joins the Battlers after two seasons at Davenport University. During his time in Grand Rapids, Lee helped the Panthers Transition from the MCLA into an NCAA DII program during two Covid shortened seasons.

Prior to his time at DU, Lee spent three seasons coaching at NCAA Division III Dean College, in Franklin, Mass. Focusing primarily on the defensive end during his time at Dean, the Bulldogs went 26-16 with a NECC conference championship during his second year with the program. He also spent one season as a volunteer assistant at his alma mater, DIII New England College, where the pilgrims made the conference title game that year.

Lee has spent three years coaching at the HS level, including at his home town of New Fairfield, CT. There he coached under Marty Morgan, working primarily on the defensive side of the ball. In 2016, Testor moved to Florida and became the defensive coordinator at Olympia High School. During the 2021 season he coached the Lakewood Ranch High School program in Bradenton, FL.

In 2021, Lee was the Regional Director of True Lacrosse Sarasota. Overseeing 150 athletes and 15 coaches concurrently and helping many of those athletes and their families in their recruiting process and overall development of their lacrosse skills.

Testor has also helped to grow the game internationally in Australia. He started as a player coach for the inaugural Queensland State team prior to the "Game of Origins." Later, he was a program consultant/player for the Melbourne Cricket Clubs (MCC) lacrosse section in the Victoria Lacrosse League.

As a student-athlete, Testor transferred from Mount Ida College to New England College after his freshman year. Testor was a staple on the defense for both the Mustangs and Pilgrims, helping both to conference titles and NCAA tournament appearances as a starter.

Morgan Cain - Comport

Morgan Comport is entering her first year as the Cougar's Head Women's Lacrosse Coach for the 2022-2023 season. Comport comes to Shadyside a three-year Assistant Coaching position at Division II Seton Hill University (SHU). Comport also helped coach the Griffins during the 2014-2016 seasons as a graduate assistant. While coaching at SHU, she was responsible for developing practice plans and game strategies, film and statistical analytics, player development, monitoring player academics, and all aspects of recruiting.

Comport's guidance helped the Griffins to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) West championship title in both 2021 and 2022 and two NCAA tournament appearances. Over her six years of Comport with the Griffins; nearly twenty players were selected for All-American, All-Region, and All-Conference achievements and several student-athletes earned All-Academic Team designations under her mentorship.

Beyond SHU, Comport comes to Chatham with additional coaching experience from her Head Coach position and Director at Mountain State Lacrosse (WV). Comport helped establish the first travel lacrosse program in the Mountain State. While recruiting and preparing her players for competition in premier tournaments, Comport saw to their athletic development both individually and as a team. On top of success on the field, she helped prepare her players for the recruiting process as they began their college search process as prospective student-athletes.

As a collegiate player, Comport was a dominant attacker and leader at Seton Hill. A two-year team captain, Comport earned multiple athletic awards, including the East Coach Conference Attacker (2010-2012), a Second Team Lacrosse Magazine All-American (2011), and a North-South All-Star. While starting every game of her collegiate career, she amassed 243 career points (178 goals and 65 assists).

Comport graduated in 2016 with her Masters degree in Family Therapy from Seton Hill University and also obtained her Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology and minors in Biology and Sociology in 2013, having earned All-Academic Team status.

David Pomeroy

David Pomeroy begins his second season at Davis & Elkins as the Director of Lacrosse for the 2022-2023 school year. Initially coming in as the next D&E women's lacrosse coach, Pomeroy added responsibilities for men's lacrosse in mid-July of 2021.

Bringing no shortage of playing and coaching experience with him to Elkins, Pomeroy most recently served as the inaugural head coach at NCAA DIII Marian University in Wisconsin since 2017. Pomeroy also worked with Black Lax high school club team since 2017 in Wisconsin in addition to his duties at Marian. A Baltimore, Maryland native and standout high school lacrosse player, Pomeroy spent much of his coaching tenure on the east coast.

Working for three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Pomeroy assisted with the Crimson Hawks' goalkeepers from 2013-2016. While in Indiana, Pomeroy helped IUP finish in the national rankings all three seasons while coaching six All-Americans.

Pomeroy worked throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with Intrepid Girls Lacrosse Club (2014-2016), as assistant coach at Indiana High School (2015-16), assistant coach at Kutztown University (2012) and head coach at Freedom High School (2011-12).

Pomeroy served as an assistant and head coach at various high schools, including Laramie, Wyoming (2007-08), and in Maryland at Dundalk (2009) and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (2009-10).

Pomeroy graduated from Rowan University with a bachelor's degree in psychology in 2012 before receiving his master's in sports management from IUP in 2016.
